






# A LOCAL CATHOLIC SCHOOL DOESN'T WANT NEIGHBORHOOD USING THE SIDEWALK

Orlando City Council voted to approve a request put forth by St. James Cathedral School to close a sidewalk that bisects its downtown campus.

We told you in February 2023 that the private school had put in a request to shut down and take over the public right-of-way along Ridgewood Street in Lake Eola Heights, in what it claimed was a reaction to a "significant increase in incidents of school violence since 1996."




The private school was granted permission to block off a section of Ridgewood Street between Hillman Avenue and Cathcart Avenue in 1996, but the City of Orlando maintained rights for pedestrians and bicycles to continue to use the right-of-way on the street as a way to pass through the school campus. This most recent request from the school was to ask the City to abandon the easement in an effort to "protect its students."

Under the newly passed agreement with the City of Orlando, the school will now be able to lock the gates to its campus and the street from midnight to 8 p.m. daily, when there are classes scheduled to occur. The request for abandonment of the street was not approved, despite a pouty-faced protest from the school lawyer.

The Lake Eola Heights Neighborhood Association, backed by district Commissioner Patty Sheehan, fought against the move, claiming the city was favoring a private organization over the needs of the neighborhood.

The agreement included a clause that reverts the street back to the city if the property, which has a Future Land Use designation of "Residential Medium Intensity," should ever be sold to another entity in the future.

### ACE CAFE ORLANDO IS OFFICIALLY CLOSED

According to a post the Ace Cafe shared on its Facebook account at 6 p.m. Sunday, May 28, they have officially closed.

The full statement is posted online.

The story was first reported by the local blog, Orlando Entertainment News, on May 4, along with the claim that someone at the company had shared that building was being sold to a private developer to be transformed into apartment towers, though that claim had not been proven true at the time of this post.

Ace Cafe staff refused to share any statements with media, declining an earlier request via Bungalower and other outlets for a statement. We have reached back out to see if they would share information on if they have indeed sold the property and to whom, or if they know of any future plans for the property, but still haven't received a response.

Ace Cafe, which is located at 100 W. Livingston Street, opened back in May 2019. The 35,000 SF complex opened with multiple dining and bar spaces, a gift shop, a motorcycle dealership, a gallery, and more.

The building was first used as a hardware and mill supply shop by Harry P. Leu, the namesake of Leu Botanical Gardens in Audubon Park, and was built in 1922 but is not considered protected by the City of Orlando.

Historical Side Note: Leu was kidnapped and thrown in the trunk of his own car while leaving this same building nearly 100 years ago. They let him out around Bithlo to walk home.

The 2.94-acre property has a current value of over \$10 million according to the Orange County Property Appraiser.



# A SPORTS-LOVING BILLIONAIRE JUST SHARED HIS PLANS FOR A BASEBALL STADIUM: DO WE CARE?

A team led by NBA exec Pat Williams, the man who is credited for bringing The Magic to Orlando, really wants the City Beautiful to have a baseball team too, and according to some fancy math on his team, having a Major League Baseball team could bring in an estimated \$40 billion to the region over 30 years.

Williams is hoping to create a billion-dollar stadium in order to lure the Tampa Bay Rays, or a franchised extension, to Orlando and he held a press conference this week to pitch some early details and renderings to drum up some hype and put some pressure on Orange County to loosen up their purse strings.

Williams filed an application with the Tourist Development Tax task force asking for \$975 million to pay for his hopeful 45,000-seat stadium, which currently has a projected cost of \$1.7 billion. The remaining piece in the funding puzzle would hopefully be paid for by the owner of the new team or The Rays if they could seduce them to move to Central Florida – a task that would be a bit easier if Williams' stadium gets built.

The Rays have been unable to build their own stadium in the Tampa area and have been forced to host their home games at the albeit, less than modern, Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg.

If Orlando is unsuccessful at convincing The Rays to move, they would have to bid against steep competition like San Antonio, Mexico City, and Salt Lake City for just two new franchises, so getting a team that's nearby to simply relocate could be an easier bet – if Orlando really wants to have a professional baseball team that is.

According to the renderings, which you can see above, Williams' new stadium would sport a clear dome, office space, restaurants, and retail, as well as 1,000 new hotel rooms on the property, located on a 35-acre lot near Aquatica on International Drive.

Williams even has a name for the new team, the "Orlando Dreamers."

While the project succeeded in attracting plenty of attraction from local baseball fans, plenty of more people are asking whether or not the area needs another stadium and if residents should be footing the bill for a man who could likely pay for the project himself.

Here's a list of local developments that are currently under construction.

- 500 NORTH ORANGE The redevelopment of a former AT&T building near downtown will culminate into a new fancy office building with 20,000 SF of ground-level retail space.
- THE GATEWAY BUILDING Advent Health is building a new 14-story building on campus in Ivanhoe Village with a 150-room hotel, a restaurant, and more.
- HOLOCAUST CENTER The Maitland-based center is opening something bigger and better on the shores of Lake Ivanhoe where the former Orlando Chamber of Commerce building currently stands. Demolition should happen any week now.
- THE MILK STACKS Adam Wonus, the de facto mayor of the Milk District, is building 27 new apartments with 10,000 SF of office in this lot near Southern Nights. They'll actually have milk stacks in the design too.
- SOCIETY ORLANDO A 700-unit, mixed-use development with multiple towers and a new e-sports tenant. More on that soon.
- SPORTS AND ENTERTAINMENT DISTRICT A massive undertaking by Orlando Magic that will put 420,000 SF of class A office space and a 300-room hotel with an events center and a parking garage directly across the street from the Amway Center. It's estimated to have a \$500 million price tag.
- URBON AT AUDUBON PARK this new luxe apartment project is bringing 490+ units to a lot behind Orlando Fashion Square.

#### CLIMBING GYM COMING TO OBT

Dr. Phillips Charities, the group behind the \$700 million Packing District development in the Fairvilla neighborhood just west of College Park, has just announced the addition of a new climbing and fitness gym. The new 45,000 SF gym will be the first Central Florida location of Tennessee-based High Point Climbing and Fitness and will feature a 55-foottall rope climbing area, a competition speed wall, a large bouldering and training area, and a 4,000 SF Kid Zone specifically for children. The facility will also have a fitness area with strength and aerobic machines, a yoga studio, locker rooms with showers, and a pro shop. It will also have a 9,000 SF dog spa and hotel on the property as well.

#### ARMSTRON LOCKS IS FOR SALE

The family-owned Armstrong Lock and Security has been in business since 1929 and they are putting their longtime home at 1120 N. Mills Avenue up for sale. The 0.37-acre property features a 2,900 SF building and 17 parking spaces – a commodity in the ever-growing Mills 50 District. It has been listed sans-asking price and is being marketed by Alex Bisbee, of Insite Real Estate, Inc. but was last assessed at \$937.278 in 2022.

#### **FAZOLI'S IS RETURNING TO O-TOWN**

15 years after it closed its last Orlando location, Fazoli's will be opening a new restaurant on Colonial Drive. The Italian-ish restaurant will be moving into a former Boston Market space at 4201 E. Colonial Drive, just east of Fashion Square Mall, and across the street from Orlando Executive Airport. The menu features Americanized versions of Italian-ish dishes like baked lasagna, baked spaghetti, chicken fettuccine alfredo, pizza, Italian ice, unlimited bread sticks, and those cookies that look like they were sculpted by robots before being plopped into little plastic envelope bags. An opening date isn't public at this time but their website says "coming soon."



#### HARMON'S GETS NEW TENANTS

The former home of Harmon Photo in Ivanhoe Village has been vacant for a number of years now but it seems its days of sitting empty have come to a close, with the signing of a new tenant. The team at Two Chic Beautique has signed the lease for the building, located at 1323 N. Orange Avenue, for use as a new salon. The new Trés Ivanhoe Salon is currently being prepped for construction to begin with a hopeful completion date by the end of the year.

## THE CITY LAUNCHED A FREE PARKING PROGRAM

The City of Orlando's Downtown Development Board re-launched PARK DTO on May 15 to provide free parking at on-street metered and non-metered spaces, via the ParkMobile app, and complimentary valet at participating restaurants. Participants can download the free ParkMobile app and receive up to two hours of parking at any downtown on-street metered and non-metered spaces using the ParkMobile code: ParkDTO.

This code can be used a maximum of four times per account. Promotion codes are valid 24 hours a day, seven days a week (on-street metered and non-metered parking is free after 6 p.m. Monday - Saturday, and free all day on Sunday). Any amount owed in excess of the validated time is the responsibility of the person parking. The program also includes complimentary valet for customers at participating restaurants between 5:30 - 9 pm. # AFTER MIDNIGHT BAR PERMITS: WHO ACTUALLY HAS ONE?

Starting this month, bars and nightclubs in the Downtown Entertainment Area are nowrequired to have a new permit in order to sell alcohol after midnight, but according to the City of Orlando, only a few bars have been issued an "After Midnight Sales Permit."

Of the 80 documented bars and nightclubs in downtown Orlando, only 51 had applied for the new permit as of May 1, with only 26 of them having been issued a special decal by the city to operate late into the night, including:

The permit, which was approved last month, requires businesses to display their hours of operation and occupancy numbers alongside the decal. In order to have a permit issued, bars must use a metal detector wand if they have more than 50 people inside at a time.

All bars will use I.D. scanners between the hours of 10 p.m. and 2 a.m. as well. Some of the larger clubs with higher capacities are also required to hire offduty officers at a rate of \$90/hour.

If they fail to keep a log of their occupancy numbers or are found to not be compliant in any way, the bars could be forced to lose their permit and their ability to sell alcohol after midnight.

The City of Orlando gave downtown bar operators just three weeks to submit for the new permits, which cost \$250 to register.

The deadline to apply for a permit was May 1, 2023.
