### NEW RENDERINGS SHARED FOR HOPEFUL CAMPING WORLD RENOVATIONS

Florida Citrus Sports recently shared concepts for the next phase of renovations at Camping World Stadium in Orlando's West Lakes neighborhood, just west of downtown Orlando near Orange Blossom Trail.

Florida Citrus Sports first shared the plans for renovations earlier this year while in the process of wooing Orange County Government for a big chunk of Tourist Development Tax dollars, \$800 million to be exact. If awarded, the funds would have been used to pay for a long list of improvements, including a fancy exoskeleton-like facade reminiscent of the abandoned Pulse Museum designs, a new 18,000-seat upper deck, wider aisles, and a 360-degree concourse – the proposed \$400 million canopy to cover the field is not part of this phase.

The Orange County Board of Commissioners didn't choose the project for this year's funding, but Mayor Dyer recently shared his hopes to issue bonds to pay for the stadium improvements along with another \$256 million for the Amway Center.

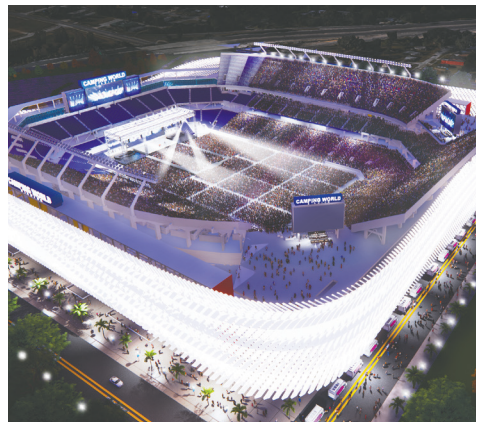

**ONEPULSE FOUNDATION TRUSTEES VOTE TO DISSOLVE ORGANIZATION**

Following a tumultuous series of events fit for an inevitable Netflix special, the trustees of the embattled OnePulse Foundation voted late Tuesday evening to dissolve the organization.

The announcement was made early Wednesday morning that the trustees would begin transferring assets to other local organizations, along with its planning and design materials for its since canceled Pulse Museum.

*“We have been challenged by unexpected and definitive events, among them the inability to secure a full donation of the Pulse nightclub site from the property owners and a global pandemic that brought with it critical limits and many unanticipated consequences, that ultimately impacted our fundraising efforts.”*

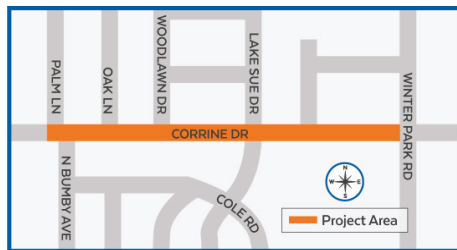

The announcement followed the resignation of Deborah Bowie, the executive director of the foundation who was hired in June 2022, following the resignation of former director and founder, Barbara Poma.

Poma, the co-owner of Pulse Nightclub, along with her husband and Daytona-based Michael Panaggio, recently made headlines when the City of Orlando agreed to purchase the Pulse Nightclub from them for \$2 million after they refused to donate it to the foundation.

The foundation announced this October that it would not be pursuing its plans to build an offsite Pulse Museum due to failed fundraising initiatives and increases in construction costs following the pandemic.

OnePulse purchased a 1.75-acre parcel for \$3.5 million in September 2019, with the hopes of opening a National Pulse Memorial and Museum sometime in 2022. Orange County government had previously agreed to award the foundation \$10 million in Tourist Development Taxes in 2018 to help purchase the land and plan the museum, which was expected to cost roughly \$15 million to build at the time.

According to a recent report by Spectrum News 13, the foundation was issued a five-page letter from Orange County Government claiming it was in violation of its TDT funding agreement by renting out the museum warehouse to a third party, in spite of the TDT agreement which states they must seek county approval for any use of the site other than the planned museum.



**CORRINE DRIVE GETS SEMI-PERMANENT BIKE LANE**

A one-day bike lane pop-up that was installed earlier this year for a May the Fourth B(like) With You cycling event has been temporarily adopted by the City of Orlando.

Then, in late September, the City of Orlando Transportation Department installed a quick-build bike path using semi-permanent materials and paint along a parking lane on the north side of Corrine Drive. That new installation will now be in place for at least six months, with an option to extend based on traffic safety data and community feedback.

According to the City of Orlando, the goal of the project this to “... address the immediate needs of the community for additional, safe, bicycle and pedestrian access, with a long-term eye toward the transformative Complete Streets project.”

Future plans for the Corrine corridor include wider sidewalks created by the elimination of westbound on-street parking, raised intersections, speed reductions, and more mid-block signalized crossings, like the one that was recently installed in front of East End Market.



**DADDY YANKEE LAUNCHES ORLANDO PRO PADEL LEAGUE TEAM**

The King of Reggaeton, Daddy Yankee, has just launched a new Pro Padel League Team in Orlando, called the “Florida Goats.” We’re still waiting for the PR team to tell us how to pronounce it, because they weren’t exactly sure either.

Padel, or padel tennis, has origins in Mexico and is similar to pickleball but can only be played as doubles, whereas pickleball can be played as both singles and doubles. It’s often referred to as a mix between squash and tennis and is one of the fastest-growing sports in the world. PPL launched in 2022 with an inaugural season featuring seven franchises ranging from Los Angeles, San Diego, Miami, Toronto, Mexico, Arkansas, and Las Vegas, with Las Vegas Smash walking away with the 2023 PPL Cup Championship win.

Major League Pickleball added an Orlando team, Orlando Squeeze, this past January.

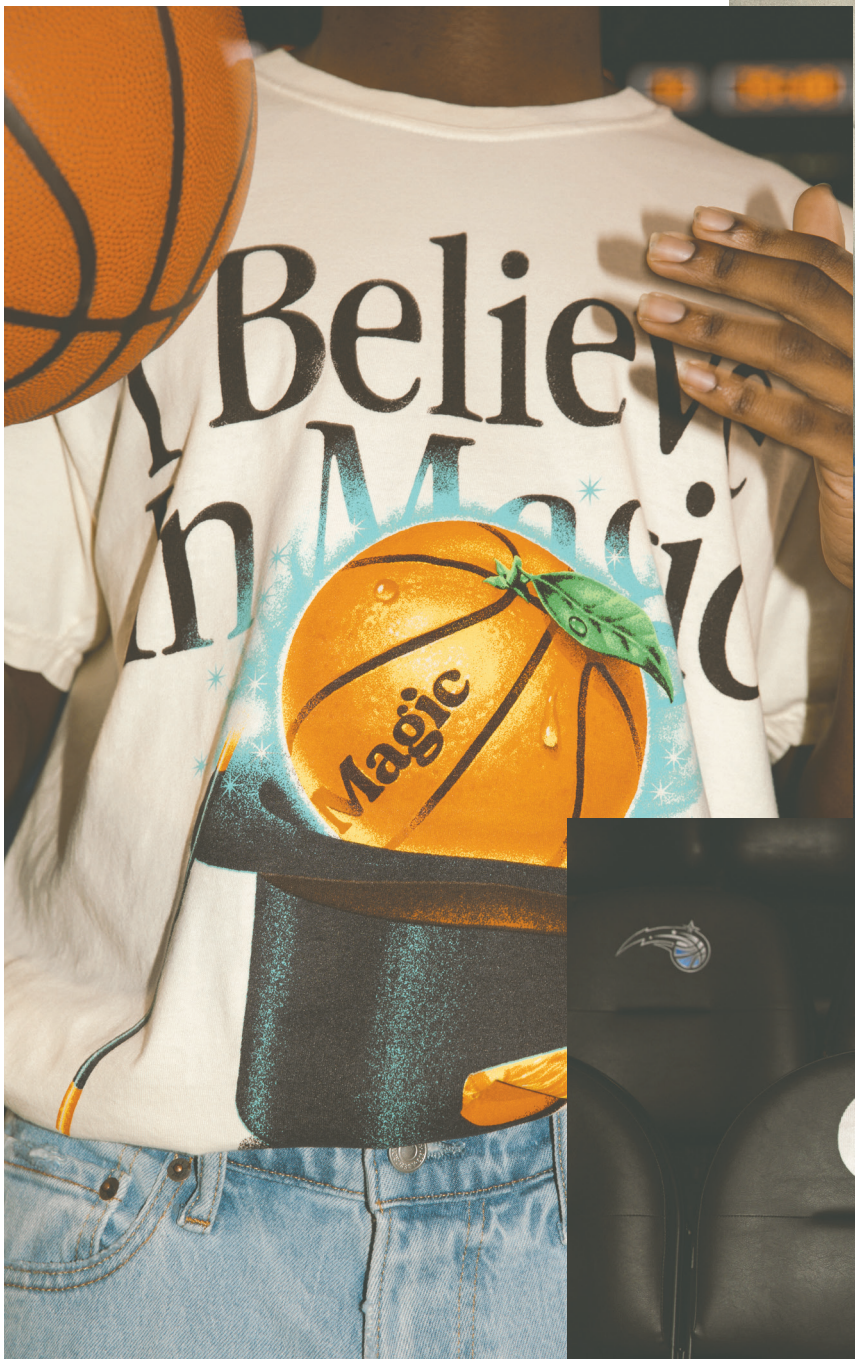
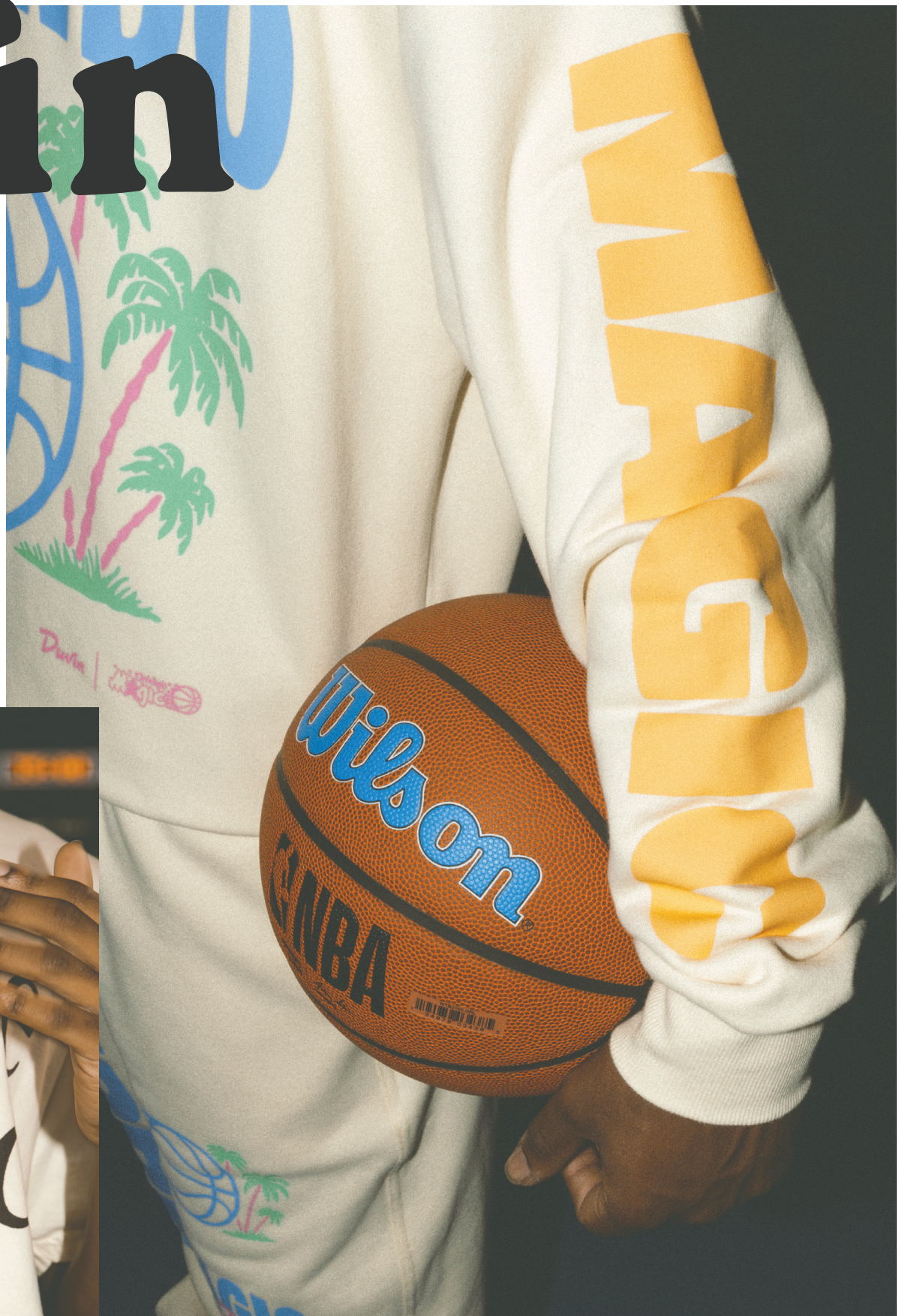
## AND ORLANDO MAGIC SET RELEASE DATE FOR NEW LINE DROP

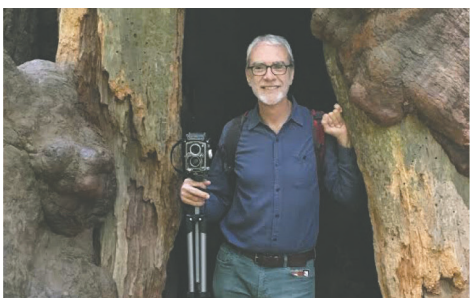
**- PERPLEXED PRESENTER**

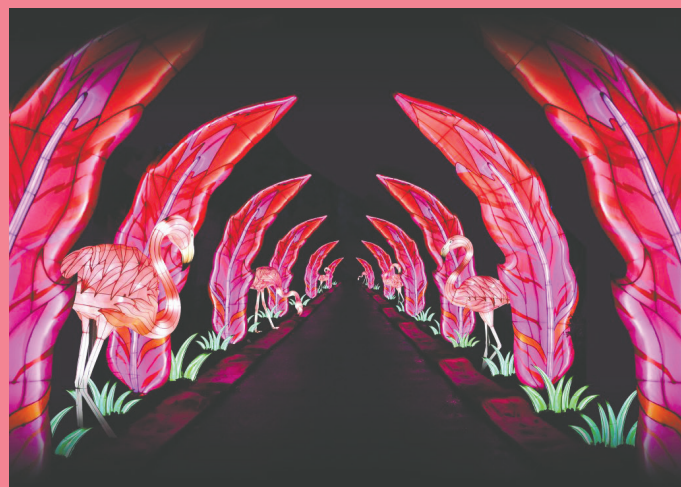

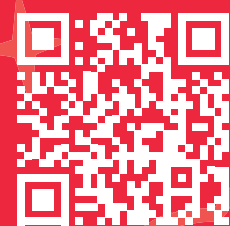

**HELLCATS USA MOVING TO AUDUBON PARK**

Local retail and design darlings Hellcats USA are jumping ship from Winter Park and opening a new shop in Audubon Park.

The popular retail shop, run by Britt Reagan and Clark Orr, will finish out the year at their current location in Winter Park before opening the new shop at 2822 Corrine Drive in January 2024 – joining established Audubon retail shops like Park Ave CDs, The Lovely Boutique, Freehand Goods, and Joybird Books.

Hellcats specializes in their own brand of clothing and accessories and first opened their Winter Park location on Orange Avenue in 2019.



**CITY HALL LEASING DOWNTOWN CORNER LOT FOR POP-UP PARK SPACE**

Orlando City Council voted to approve the lease of a vacant parcel at the corner of Orange Avenue and Pine Street at 30 S. Orange Avenue during the October 9, 2023, Council Meeting, in order to carry out a series of improvements to transform the space into a new urban pocket park.

Despite being located on one of the busiest intersections in downtown Orlando, the lot has sat empty for over a decade. The building that had originally occupied that corner was built in 1886 but burned down years later and was never replaced.

Now, thanks to the City of Orlando, the site will soon be occupied by an urban pocket park/plaza that will feature chairs, tables, and an art installation. The CRA will be paying \$500 per month in rent and is responsible for stormwater utility fees during the lease, which is currently set to renew every year.

The lot was home to a shortlived installation care of Insomniac Events and the Electric Daisy Carnival leading up to the most recent festival, before being removed to allow for construction on the site. Crews started laying down crushed stone/aggregate this past Monday to make it more accessible for public use and the installation will return once the work is complete in roughly three weeks.

The lot recently received a new mural care of Visit Orlando's "Unbelievably Real" brand initiative earlier in the year.




**CITY HANGS JACK KAZANZAS STAR AHEAD OF THANKSGIVING**

The annual Orlando tradition of raising the Jack Kazanzas Star over Orange Avenue has just taken place, marking the official start of the holiday season in downtown Orlando.

The raising of the 600-pound light-up star has been taking place since the 1950s, when two competing department stores, Ivey's and Dickson and Ives, would join together to celebrate Christmas by stringing the star between both of their buildings at Central and Orange.

In 1984, the star had fallen into disrepair, and lifelong resident Jack Kazanzas, rallied the city to raise funds and replace it with a new installation that features 4,000 LED lights.

Traditionally, the star is raised after Thanksgiving, but City Hall must have felt the need to bring some holiday cheer downtown a little earlier this year. City District Main Street lit its Christmas tree last week and Ivanhoe Village flipped the switch on its Happy Holiday Sign on the historic OUC building for Jingle Eve.

## CHRISTMAPOLITAN

The annual Christmas-themed bar take-over, Miracle on Orange, has returned for its second year since The Courtesy Bar opened in Winter Park last year.

Their regular cocktail menu is not available during Miracle but will return in the new year. They've selflessly provided the recipe for one of their signature drinks - the Christmapolitan - so you can share in the miracle at home.

### INGREDIENTS

- 2 oz vodka
- 1/4 oz elderflower liqueur (St-Germain)
- 1/4 oz dry vermouth (Noilly Prat Extra Dry)
- 1 oz spiced cranberry sauce (recipe below)
- 1/2 oz lime juice
- Absinthe spritz (Pernod)

### METHOD

1. Spray a chilled coupe cocktail glass with absinthe mist.
2. Place all ingredients into a cocktail shaker, top with ice, shake and strain into the prepared glass.
3. Garnish with a rosemary sprig resting on the side of the glass.

### DRINK NOTES

Created by Nico de Soto, adapted by Joann Spiegel.

A seasonal twist on the Cosmopolitan, the Christmapolitan has been on the Miracle menu since 2014 and has proven to be a best-seller each year.

The cranberry sauce keeps well - Courtesy makes 3-5 gallons at a time. They also batch the alcohol portion so when building this drink, it's a 2 1/2 oz pour of that batch, then add the syrup and citrus. Spray the glass with absinthe (not the drink) and use a healthy sprig of rosemary to garnish - you want to get that rosemary scent when taking a sip.

**COCKTAIL:** CHRISTMAPOLITAN | **YIELD:** 107 OZ (107 SERVINGS)

INGREDIENTS:

32 fl oz	1 kg	100% cranberry juice
	379 g	cranberry sauce (jellied, canned)
20 fl oz	591 g	water
3 1/2 cups	600 g	sugar, light brown
4 1/2 cups	900 g	sugar, white
4 fl oz	120 g	orange juice
	30 g	orange peel
8 ea	42 g	cinnamon sticks, whole
	5 g	allspice, ground
	5 g	salt, kosher
	3 g	nutmeg, ground
	2 g	cloves, ground

- METHOD:**
- 1 Mix the cranberry juice, water, and jellied cranberry sauce together then blend to dissolve the jelly.
  - 2 Crack, grind, and heat all dry spices until aromatic in a medium saucepan.
  - 3 Add the dissolved cranberry mixture and all remaining ingredients to the saucepan and bring to a rapid boil.
  - 4 Reduce heat to maintain a rapid simmer and reduce liquid for 20 minutes.
  - 5 Remove from heat and allow to cool.
  - 6 Once cool, use a bouillon strainer to strain.
  - 7 Bottle, date, and refrigerate.

Death in the Afternoon is a new "friendly neighborhood absinthe house" that is opening in the former home of Retromended Vintage at 930 N. Mills Avenue. The name comes from the 1932 non-fiction work by Ernest Hemingway on the traditions of Spanish bullfighting, and a cocktail he invented (allegedly) during his time in Key West. The recipe was featured in a 1935 cocktail book featuring recipes from 30 celebrity authors of the time, "So Red the Nose, or Breath in the Afternoon."

The new space held a brief soft-open in November and is now open to the public on Tuesdays through Sundays, 5 p.m.-midnight.

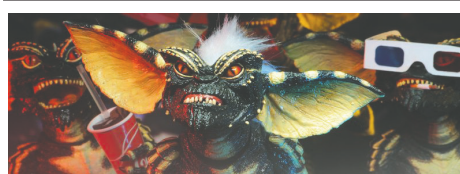

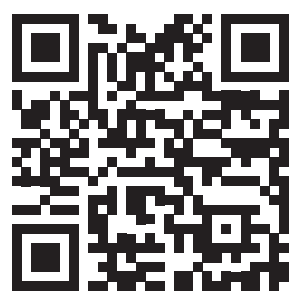
